

# Don't give fruit fly a free ride

## Fruit flies could be hiding in:

apple	feijoa	mango
avocado	fig	orange
banana	grapefruit	passionfruit
berries	grapes	pawpaw
capsicum	guava	pear
chilli	lemon	persimmon
crab apple	lime	quince
cumquat	loquat	tamarillo
eggplant	mandarin	tomato

Fruit Fly is a major pest, threatening our horticultural producers and their access to valuable markets.

To protect our growers, there are restrictions about which fruit and vegetables you can take into the Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone (shown below), the Greater Sunraysia Pest Free Area, Riverina Production Areas and across state borders. Fruit fly can hitch a ride on fruits such as:

- ✦ tropical and temperate fruits (eg: berries, grapes, mango, avocado)
- ✦ pome fruits (eg: apples, pears and quinces)
- ✦ citrus fruits
- ✦ stone fruits (eg: peaches and apricots)
- ✦ fruiting vegetables (eg: capsicums, chillies, eggplants, tomatoes and tamarillos)

**You cannot take any fruit or vegetables across the border into South Australia.**



### FINES OF UP TO \$20,000 MAY APPLY

Please eat or dispose of your fruit, fruiting vegetables and other restricted produce at the disposal sites provided before entering the Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone, Pest Free Areas, Protected Areas over the state border into South Australia.
