Labels

Always read the label or have it explained to you.

Look for the words CAUTION or POISON on the label. Take care in handling, storage and use.

CAUTION

- Low to moderate hazard.
- May cause minor injury.
- Unlikely to cause fatal poisoning.

POISON

- Moderate to high hazard.
- May cause severe injury.
- Low risk of fatal poisoning.

Poisoning and First Aid

Ring the **Poisons Information Centre** immediately on **131 126** if you think that someone has been poisoned. You may need to take the person to a doctor or hospital.

Call the **Australian Government's Translating and Interpreting Service (TIS)** on **131 450** if you have trouble speaking English, and the TIS interpreter will call the Poisons Information Centre for you.



Disposal

Dispose of unwanted hazardous substances free of charge at the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Household Hazardous Waste Depot. For more information ring the **EPA** on **8204 2004**.

Location: corner of Magazine Road and Henschke Street, Dry Creek.
Opening times: first Tuesday of every month between 9 am and 12 noon.
