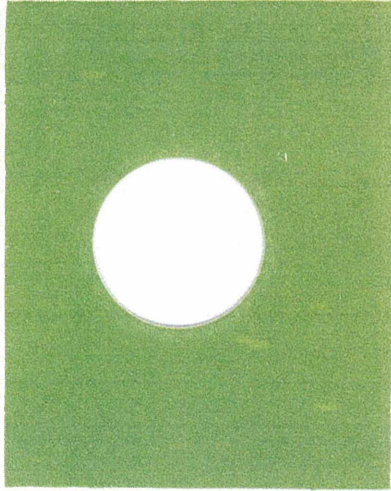

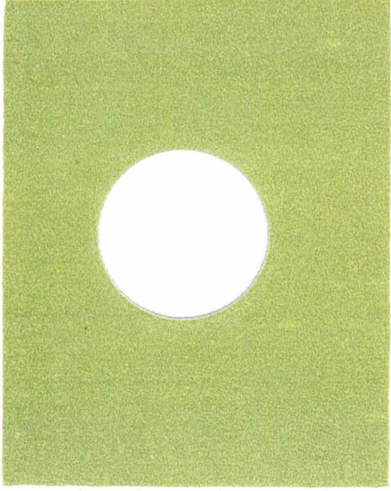
COLOUR CHART FOR THE PICKING OF APPLES FOR EXPORT.

Place the non-flushed surface of the apple behind each hole in turn and note the colour on the chart nearest to that of this non-flushed surface of the fruit.

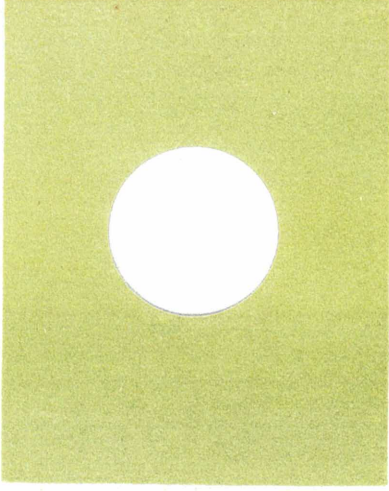

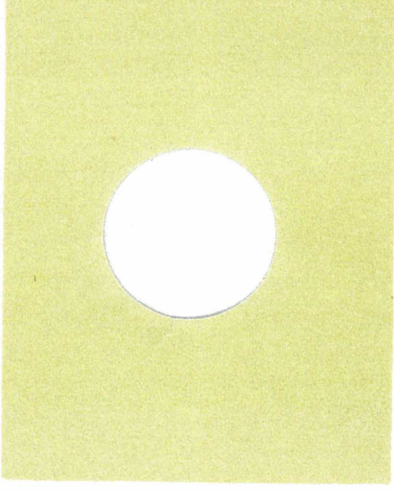

NOTE: Commence picking when the green or unflushed surface of the apple shows the first signs of the correct colour as indicated above. Where the shades of colour given on the card do not conform to those of the fruit under examination, regard only the amount of green or yellow present in the fruit and in this chart colours.
