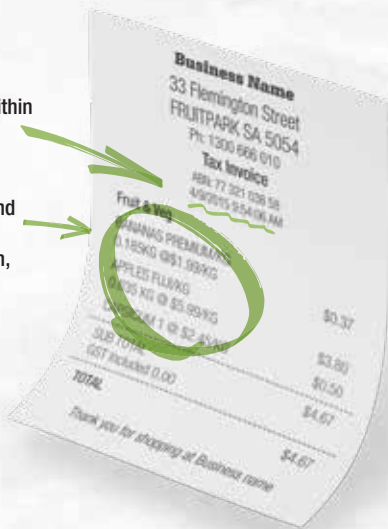


# Remember your receipt

You are only allowed to bring fruit or fruiting vegetables purchased from a shop if you are travelling **WITHIN** South Australia to the Riverland. Make sure you keep your receipt for inspection when at a quarantine station or random roadblock.

Must be purchased within  
the last two weeks.

Itemised list of fruit and  
fruiting vegetables  
(e.g. tomato, capsicum,  
eggplant and chilli).



**NOTE:** Fruit or fruiting vegetables **MUST NOT** be brought into SA from any other state. All other mainland states and territories currently have fruit fly.
