I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* which was received by the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) on 9 October 2023, seeking access to the following:

"When was the Pine Scale first detected at the Awoonga Rd site. Hope Valley. Is it possible to view the report please of when the Pine Scale was first detected plus any treatment plans or maintenance carried out from the first detection"

Determination 2

I have determined that access to the following document is refused:

Access to the above document is refused pursuant to Clause 9(1) of Schedule 1 of the Freedom of Information Act which states:

"9—Internal working documents

- (1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter—
 - (a) that relates to -
 - (i) any opinion, advice or recommendation that has been obtained, prepared or recorded; or

(ii) any consultation or deliberation that has taken place, in the course of, or for the purpose of, the decision-making functions of the Government, a Minister or an agency; and

(b) the disclosure of which would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest."

The document consists of advice being prepared for consideration by the Giant Pine Scale Working Group. The advice, in the format of an incident response plan, is a draft version and is still being updated.

In addressing the public interest test for the exemption, I have balanced the following factors:

In favour of the public interest:

- Meeting the objects of the Act favouring access to documents.
- Ensuring optimal use of public resources.
- High level of interest in the accountability of public office holders.
- The importance of transparency and openness and the interest that the public has in the decision-making processes of Government.

Contrary to the public interest:

- The recent age of the information was considered.
- The continuing relevance of matters still under consideration.
- The need to preserve confidentiality with regard to the subject matter until a final decision has been made.
- The amount of information that is not already publicly available.
- Protection of the deliberative processes of Government.
- Maintaining the efficient conduct of Government.

• Disclosing this information may compromise the manner in which information is gathered in the future for the decision-making processes of Government to the detriment of the betterment for South Australia.

Having considered the various factors weighing for and against disclosure, I have determined that disclosure of this document would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

If you are dissatisfied with this determination, you are entitled to exercise your right of review and appeal as outlined in the attached documentation <u>Making a Freedom of</u> <u>Information Application | State Records of South Australia (archives.sa.gov.au)</u>, by completing the "FOI Application Form for Internal Review of a Determination" and returning the completed form to:

Hi Everyone again, we have done the sweep through Elliston reserve today and found a total of 28 trees infected, There is 188 pines within the reserve and we found evidence on the ground around another 2 trees but are unable to see any on the tree itself, so we would think it may be in the upper canopy.

The other thing we have noticed is the bees are feeding off the GPS and they also could be a host for moving the insect. We have sprayed the site and it will now be fenced off tomorrow as it's quite a large area that needs to be bunted off.

We will be using barrier mesh as temp fencing would be at a considerable cost. Is there any signage from either PIRSA or Biosecurity that explains why this area is closed off that could be placed on the site to deter people entering the site?

The biggest issue is there was quite a bit of material from the GPS that was on the footpath and on the road. With approx. 25 cars passing per minute this has spread the material up to Lower North East Road. We have sprayed all of the grounded material from the GPS.

We then decided to have a look in our biodiversity reserve 600m up the road at Turramurra. We found numerous Callitris pines also infested with what we believe to be GPS. See attached photos.

Morning everyone, we will be fencing off the infested area today to prevent public from the area. We will also do a sweep through the section of the reserve around the bike track to ensure no further trees are affected. We will be spraying the ground and foot path where the GPS is currently with an insecticide Bifentherin which binds to the soil and doesn't move. We also have the decontamination process and material from the Balmoral infestation.

Hi Brad,

Thanks for sending through further photos of the trees and confirming the presence of GPS on multiple trees at Elliston Reserve. As discussed on the phone, PIRSA's Biosecurity team have advised:

- to restrict access to the infested areas at Ellison Reserve
- try to deter birds in the area as they can spread GPS
- it is not practical or effective to spray the trees with insecticide

- keeping in mind the nearby waterways and houses, certain insecticides may be useful in controlling the insects on the footpaths
- PIRSA are looking into raising awareness on GPS via media/ comms
- PIRSA surveillance staff may be able to survey the area next week

I'll keep in touch and provide further information when I can.


