Fisheries Management (Fish Processors) Regulations 2017

Regulation 11

Revocation

As of 9 June 2023 the Determination made for the purposes of Regulation 11 dated 13 May 2023 will be hereby revoked.

Determination

For the purpose of regulation 11 relating to the processing of Blue Crab from a holder of a licence in respect of the Blue Crab Fishery – I make the following determinations commencing 9 June 2023 –

Registered fish processors must record, provide information and deal with fish as described in this part where they have taken delivery of Blue Crab and an electronic report 'Blue Crab – CDR (Part B)' record.

Regulation 11(1)(a) – (c) (record and provide information, arrangements for fish)

A registered fish processor who purchases or obtains Blue Crab from-

- (a) the holder of a licence or permit in respect of the Blue Crab Fishery; or
- (b) the holder of a licence in respect of the Marine Scalefish Fishery that is subject to a condition fixing a Blue Crab quota entitlement; or
- (c) an agent of the holder of a licence or permit referred to in paragraph (a) or (b),

must— on taking delivery of the Blue Crab immediately weigh the Blue Crab and immediately complete Part B of the electronic report 'Blue Crab – CDR (Part B)' record in respect of the Blue Crab.

(1) Where a registered fish processor processes Blue Crab he or she must keep an accurate record of all purchases, sales, movements and transfers; and

Ensure that these records are-

- (a) maintained in good condition and are legible;
- (b) kept in a readily accessible place; and
- (c) able to be produced for inspection by a Fisheries Officer on request.

Regulation 11(3) (keeping records)

(1) Where the Department has received a completed electronic report, no further records need be kept for the purposes of this determination.

For the purposes of this determination -

Electronic report – means an entry received in the eCatch electronic database created and administered by the Department.

Department – means the Department of Primary Industries and Regions South Australia.
