Fisheries Management (Prawn Fishery) Regulations 2017

For the purpose of regulation 11 relating to catch and disposal requirements for the Gulf St. Vincent Prawn Fishery – I make the following determinations –

Regulation 11(1)(a) (record information)

- (1) The holder of a licence in respect of the Gulf St. Vincent Prawn Fishery or the registered master of a registered boat from which aquatic resources are taken under such a licence must comply with the following provisions:
 - (a) before the aquatic resources are removed from the boat, he or she must complete a return from the South Australian Gulf St Vincent Prawn Fishery Catch Disposal and Unloading Logbook (CDR) provided by the Department and deliver the return to the Department at the address on the logbook within 48 hours after unloading the aquatic resources;
 - (b) he or she must ensure that the book containing CDRs is kept on board the boat until all the CDR returns in the book are completed.
- (2) Prior to aquatic resources being removed from the boat the CDR must be completed in full.
- (3) The licence holder or the registered master must ensure that the CDR is completed on each day that fishing activity is undertaken pursuant to this licence.

Regulation 11(1)(b) (Provide information)

- (1) The holder of a licence in respect of the Gulf St. Vincent Prawn Fishery or the registered master of a registered boat from which aquatic resources are taken under such a licence must comply with the following provisions:
 - (a) he or she may transmit a copy of the completed CDR form to the Department via email to <u>PIRSA.FisheriesInformationServices@sa.gov.au</u> or Fax on 08 8207 5415, within 48 hours after the aquatic resources are removed from the boat; and
 - (b) he or she must, within 48 hours after the aquatic resources are removed from the boat, deliver the completed CDR form to the Department c/o -

Primary Industries and Regions SA, Fisheries GPO Box 1625 Adelaide SA 5001.

(2) The holder of the licence or the registered master must prior report to Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 2 hours prior to the departing port to undertake fishing activities and provide information about where the fishing activities will take place.
