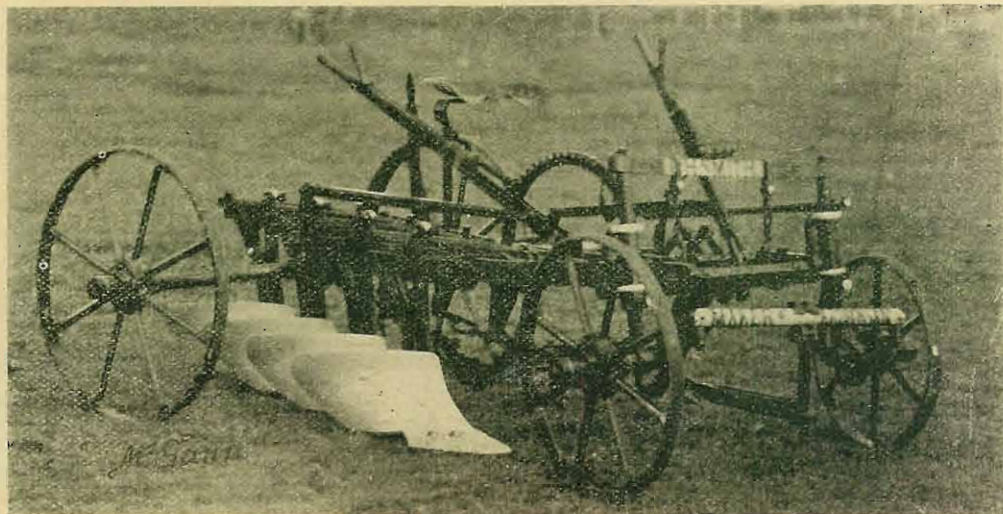

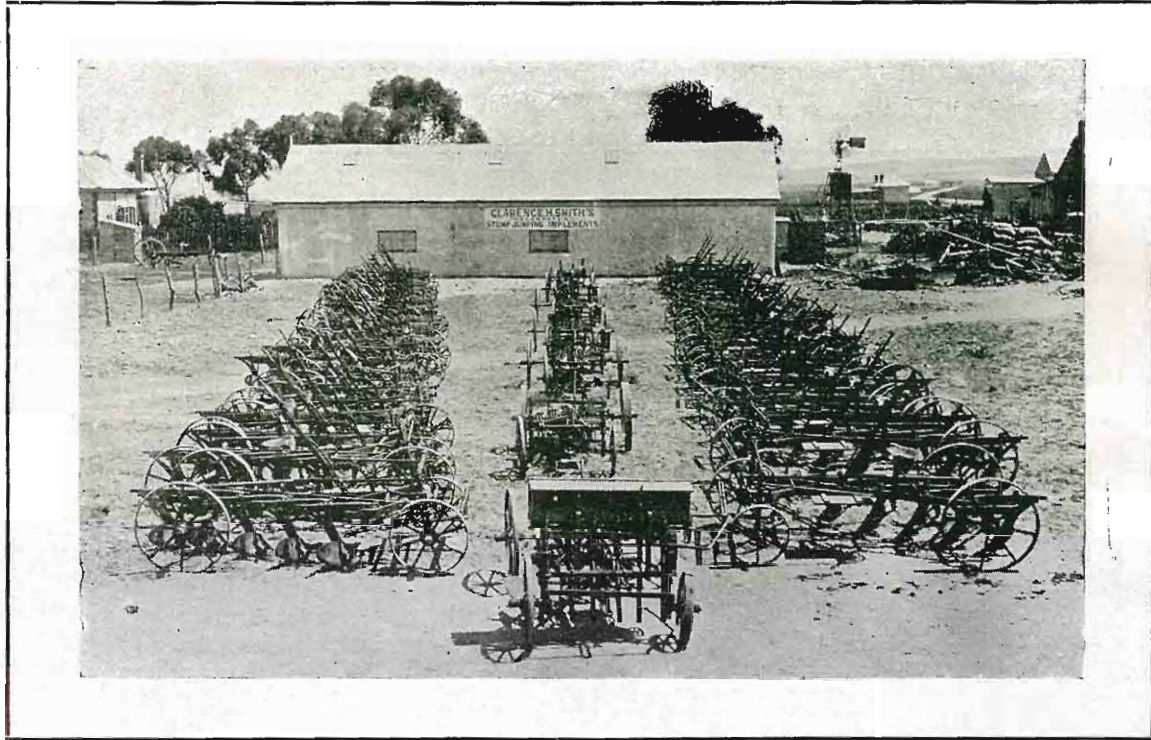

"Upon the five-furrow plough is affixed a Patented Anti-Jolting Device, which effectually prevents the implement from being strained in the slightest degree, even when worked on the roughest land. Like most utilitarian inventions, it is of simple construction. When going over stumps or stones the chain contrivance attached to the cross-bar takes the entire weight of the frame, keeping it in a perfectly horizontal position, however much either of the front wheels may be forced up or down from the level, and thus the frame is prevented from twisting, and one of the greatest achievements in stump-jump ploughmaking has been effected."

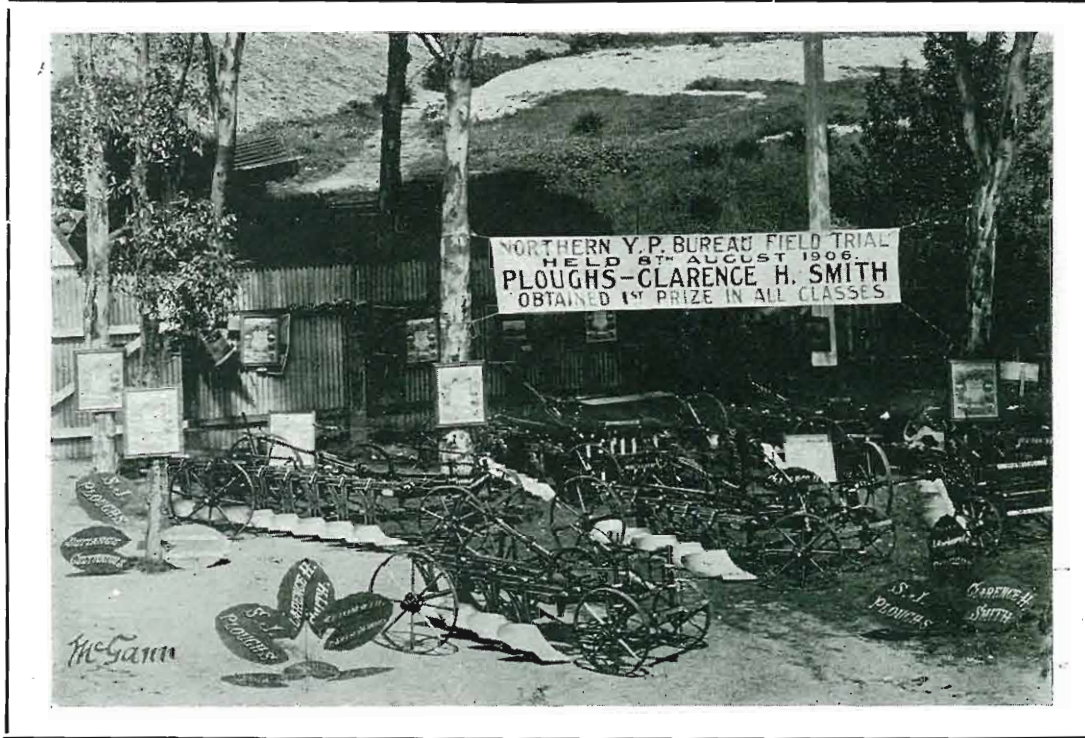

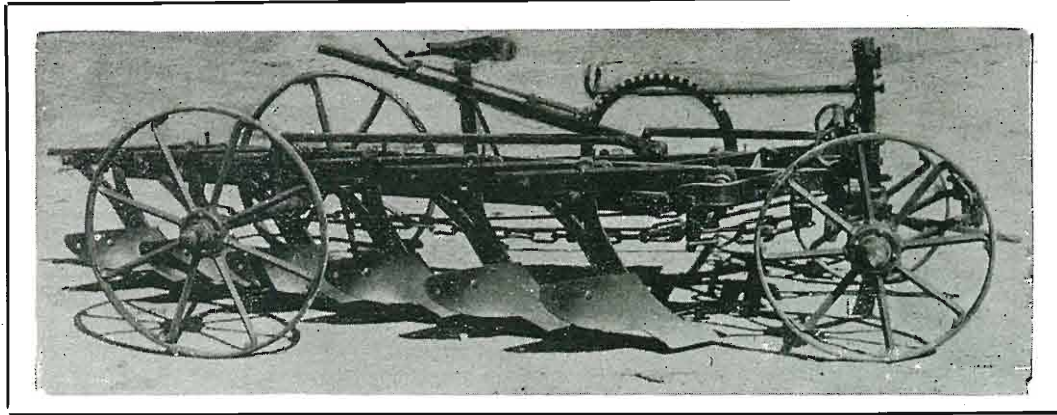

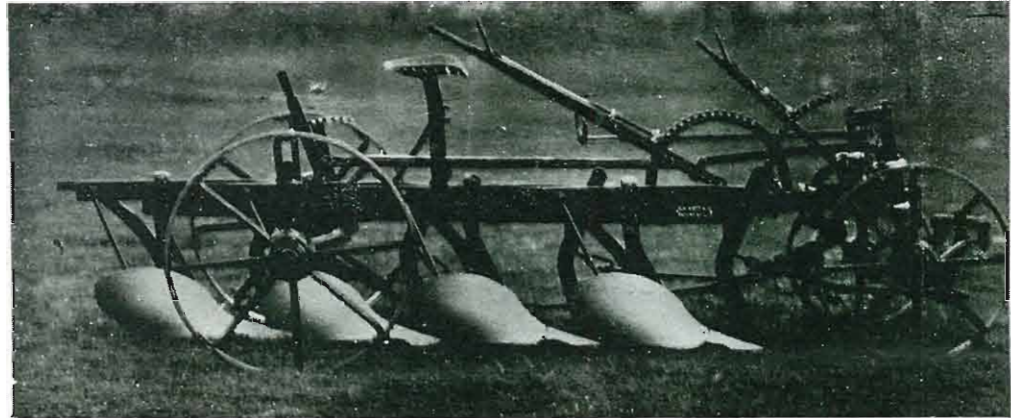

Extract from "Advertiser" report of the Great Field Trial held at Bute, under the auspices of the Northern N.P. Bureau Field Trial Society, on Wednesday, July 31st, 1895.

.....

"On Wednesday there were 18 entries with stump-jump ploughs, and all of the leading makers of this class of implements in the colony were represented. Consequently it is not surprising that there was a large attendance, and it is estimated that nearly 2,000 people were present at Mr. Norman's property during the day, over 1,000 paying for admission at the gates. Altogether 72 furrows were being turned at one time, and it took a very short while when once the lands were struck out to alter the appearance of the country. In the four-furrow section Mr. C. H. Smith, of Ardrossan, was a competitor, and at an early stage it was evident that the well-known Peninsula manufacturer would not be overlooked when the awards were made. Mr. Smith has lived in mallee country for a great many years, and is therefore fully aware of the requirements of scrub farmers. Having this knowledge, he has improved his ploughs every year, and it would now be difficult to find room for further improvement. At shows and field trials on the Peninsula he has taken a great number of prizes, and on this occasion his plough was the subject of much favorable comment. The implement was also well handled by Mr. Wilson, and it may be safely asserted that its work was equal to that of any plough on the field. A great improvement to the plough is a newly-constructed lever, which is a very ingenious piece of workmanship, it being possible for the driver to lift the ploughs out while in motion without leaving his seat, either in starting or finishing his land. It is also fitted with an excellent steering gear, and the ploughs are constructed more on the paring principle, with shares exhibiting a good cutting service. By this means a better furrow was left, and it gave the plough a big advantage over the others competing. The workmanship was of a high order of merit, and the implement was strongly built.

"In the five-furrow class there was only one entry, and this was a plough manufactured by Mr. Smith, but owned by Mr. B. G. Axford, of Wiltunga. This plough also did good work, and was constructed somewhat on the same principle as the four-furrow from the same factory. Great interest was centred in the competition between the six six-furrow paring ploughs, which were allotted a good area on the eastern side of the paddock; and their lightness of draught, combined with the rapidity with which they covered the ground, should bring them greatly into favor at no distant date. In light country like the mallee, where deep ploughing is not resorted to, it is necessary to turn over as much land in a day as is possible with a minimum of hauling power, and in this respect the paring ploughs supply what is required. In this class again Mr. Smith was very successful, as both the first and second ploughs were made by him, and the decision of the judges was to the effect that they were the best implements on the field. At all events they secured the greatest aggregate of points, viz., $89\frac{1}{2}$ and $89\frac{1}{4}$, while the plough placed in the third position was only credited with $66\frac{1}{4}$ points. When it is also explained that the judges did their work independently of each other, it will be seen that the work of the Ardrossan exhibitor was of no mean merit. The ploughs, which were worked with six horses, were fitted with many of the improvements used on Mr. Smith's four-furrow plough, the lifting and steering gear being practically the same, and excellent work was done in covering the weeds. A special share made by Mr. Smith was used."

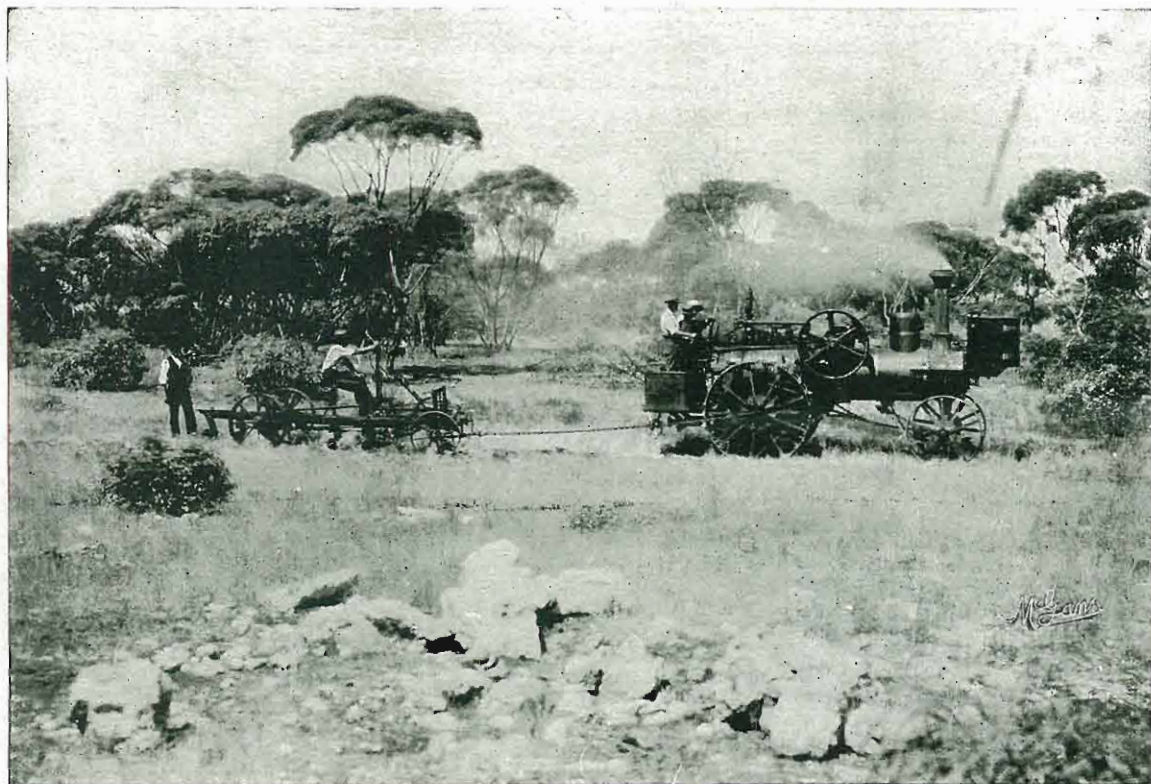

EXTRACT FROM "THE REGISTER," 10th August, 1906:—

"In the 5-furrow section there were 11 ploughs (10 makers) represented, and each was a South Australian manufacturer. These consisted of Clarence H. Smith (Ardrossan), J. & D. Shearer (Kilkenny and Mannum), H. J. Wishart (Auburn), J. H. Barnes (Bute), J. W. Jones & Co. (Adelaide), W. H. May and Sons (Wallaroo), Shepherd, McDonald, & Smelt (Bute), Triumph Plow Company (Adelaide), and Martin & Co. (Gawler). The three judges gave points—amounting in all to 100—in selecting the best plough for stump-jumping facilities, construction and durability, ploughing of ground, facilities of adjustment, packing furrows, and price. They made their points independently; the three totals were added, and an average struck. In this way the **First Prize** was awarded to **Mr. Clarence H. Smith's Plough**, which secured the **creditable average** of **93 $\frac{2}{3}$ points**. The..... plough came second, with **88 $\frac{2}{3}$ points**. As an indication of the unanimity with which the judges allotted their points, there was rarely a difference of four in the totals.

"In the second section, for seven or more furrow stump-jump plough, **Mr. Clarence H. Smith's Nine-Furrow Implement** was placed **at the head** of the four exhibits, with the **excellent total** of **97 points out of the possible 100**, and.....scored **87 $\frac{1}{3}$ points** in second position.
