

Fisheries Management (Fish Processors) Regulations 2017

Regulations 15A, 15B, 15C and 15D

For the purpose of Regulation 15A, 15B, 15C and 15D relating to the processing of King George Whiting, Snapper, Southern Calamari and Southern Garfish by Restricted Fish Processors who also hold a Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence I make the following determination –

Regulation 15A, 15B, 15C, 15D (1) (a) (record processor information)

A restricted fish processor who has taken possession of King George Whiting, Snapper, Southern Calamari or Southern Garfish taken from a fishing zone as described in the *Fisheries Management (Marine Scalefish Fishery) Regulations 2017* must;

- (1) Keep a sales and consignment record for each of the premises, places, boats or vehicles used by the fish processor for, or in connection with, the processing, storage or transport of, or dealing with, aquatic resources; and
- (2) Complete a sales and consignment record for any King George Whiting, Snapper, Southern Calamari or Southern Garfish immediately after the fish are sold or leave the fish processors possession including in that record:
 - (a) The date of the sale; and
 - (b) The form of the fish; and
 - (c) The weight of the Snapper, King George Whiting, Southern Calamari or Garfish sold; and
 - (d) The initial of the Fisher who took the fish; and
- (3) The sales and consignment record must be completed -
 - (a) immediately after the Snapper, King George Whiting, Southern Calamari or Southern Garfish are sold or leave the fish processors possession, whichever is first, in the Sales and Consignment book; and
 - (b) in the order in which the transactions to which the information relates occurred; and
 - (c) so that each entry is made immediately below the previous entry and each page of the book or register is completed before an entry is made on the next page.

Regulation 15A, 15B, 15C, 15D (2) (a) (provide fish processor information)

A restricted fish processor who has taken possession of King George Whiting, Snapper, Southern Calamari or Southern Garfish taken from a fishing zone as described in the *Fisheries Management (Marine Scalefish Fishery) Regulations 2017* must -

- (a) Within 48 hours of completing the full page of a Sales and Consignment Record or within 15 days of the end of the month

- (whichever is earlier) submit or cause to be submitted a copy of the completed white copy of the MSF-CDR to the Department electronically to pirsa.fisherieslicensing@sa.gov.au; or
- (b) Submit or cause to be submitted a copy of the completed white copy of the MSF-CDR to the Department by fax to 08 8207 5331; or
- (c) Deliver or cause to be delivered the completed white copy of the Sales and Consignment Record to the Department within 48 hours of completing the CDR in a reply-paid envelope to: PIRSA Fisheries & Aquaculture, GPO Box 1625, Adelaide SA 5001.
- (4) The restricted Fish processor must;
- (a) ensure that if Sales and Consignment Record page is cancelled, all copies of the record are marked with the word "cancelled" and the cancelled white copy of the Sales and Consignment Record are delivered within 7 days to: PIRSA Fisheries & Aquaculture, GPO Box 1625, Adelaide SA 5001.

Regulation 15A, 15B, 15C, 15D (4) (keep record)

- 1) A restricted fish processor must —
- a) make a copy of Sales and Consignment record that he or she completes under this determination
- b) retain the copy for a period of 12 months after the aquatic resources to which they relate were sold by the fish processor; and
- c) retain that record at or in the premises, place, boat or vehicle to which they relate.
