#### Determination under the Freedom of Information Act 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* which was received by the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) on 18 August 2023, seeking access to the following:

- "All substantive correspondence with inter-state agencies about Salmonella Enteriditis (SE) between 1 September 2018 30 March 2019. This request is not intended to include administrative correspondence (meeting invites, etc) but should include all other correspondence.
- All notifications of outbreaks of SE within your jurisdiction between 1 September 2018 – 30 March 2019."

On 25 August 2023, contact was made with you by PIRSA's Senior Freedom of Information Advisor and it was clarified that inter-state agencies refers to PIRSA's interstate counterparts (public sector agencies).

Pursuant to Section 14A of the Freedom of Information Act, the legislative timeframe in which to provide a determination was extended until 9 October 2023.

Accordingly, the following determination has been finalised.

I have located eleven documents that are captured within the first paragraph of your request. No documents were located in response to the second paragraph.

Access to the above document is refused pursuant to Clause 12(1) of Schedule 1 of the Freedom of Information Act and Section 74 of the *Veterinary Practice Act 2003*.

Clause 12(1) of Schedule 1 of the Freedom of Information Act states:

# "12—Documents the subject of secrecy provisions

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would constitute an offence against an Act."

Section 74 of the Veterinary Practice Act states:

# "74—Confidentiality

- (1) A person engaged or formerly engaged in the administration of this Act or the repealed Act must not divulge or communicate personal information obtained (whether by that person or otherwise) in the course of official duties except—
  - (a) as required or authorised by or under this Act or any other Act or law; or
  - (b) with the consent of the person to whom the information relates;or
  - (c) in connection with the administration of this Act or the repealed Act; or
  - (d) to an authority with responsibility for administering a corresponding law in connection with the administration of that law; or
  - (e) to an authority or other body in connection with the establishment or administration of a national database envisaged by section 75.

Maximum penalty: \$10 000."

The document consists of laboratory results.

The information was obtained by authorised officers of PIRSA's Biosecurity Division for the purpose of enforcing compliance with the Veterinary Practice Act.

Disclosure of this information would breach the agency's duties and obligation under Section 74 of the Veterinary Practice Act regarding disclosure of confidential information obtained in enforcing the Act.

Accordingly, pursuant to Clause 12(1) of Schedule 1 of the Freedom of Information Act, the release of this information would constitute an offence against an Act.



# Salmonella enterica serovar Enteritidis (SE)

- > 2000 serovars of Salmonella enterica
- SE emerged as foodborne pathogen in 1988
- Human infection
  - Clinical presentation: fever, diarrhoea, loss of appetite, headache, stomach cramps, nausea and vomiting
  - Salmonella infection is a notifiable condition
- Poultry infection
  - Clinical presentation: depression, poor growth, weakness, diarrhoea, and dehydration or none
  - Detection is notifiable
- Can contaminate eggs before the shells are formed
- SE is not considered endemic in Australian poultry







Hi Yoni,

Although we audit every egg farm we do not test either eggs or the environment. In the past we have found that egg testing is very hit and miss you need to do a lot of them and even testing the environment in free range farms requires dedication and a lot of sampling.

All of the eggs from this farm go into your market so we have no association with food borne outbreaks from that farm.

However this MLVA type is one of 2 common types of S.Tm 9 which we see here on a number of different farms spread all over the state and not necessarily connected and is well lodged on these farms – in the environment, wild birds, rodents, foxes etc.

Until proper refrigeration from the time of pack is mandatory in this country then we will see these issues. If they have been involved in point source outbreaks then concentration on egg handling and hygiene and control of raw egg products needs to be addressed but sporadic cases in humans is difficult.
