RE: ADELAIDE DOLPHIN SANCTUARY – TEMPORARY FISHING PROHIBITION

I am writing requesting your urgent assistance to declare temporary prohibitions on certain fishing activity to protect the dolphin population in the Adelaide Dolphin Sanctuary, in accordance with your powers in the *Fisheries Management Act 2007.*

Background

The Adelaide Dolphin Sanctuary (ADS) is a marine mammal protected area covering waters including the Port Adelaide River and Barker Inlet, extending north to Port Gawler. The ADS is managed by the National Parks and Wildlife Service, Department for Environment and Water, under the *Adelaide Dolphin Sanctuary Act 2005* (ADS Act). ADS dolphins are highly valued by the community.

Since 1989, 34 dolphin entanglement incidents have been observed in the ADS. In some cases the dolphins were able to free themselves. In 11 cases, the entanglement was considered sufficiently life threatening to warrant intervention by rangers, including the capture and disentanglement of the animals. Four of the last six incidents have involved heavy fishing gear used to target larger fish species such as kingfish and stingrays.

In 2019, a resident ADS adult female dolphin died due to a very severe entanglement after taking baits deployed by fishers seeking kingfish in the Port River. The dolphin ingested multiple large hooks and heavy-gauge line, eventually dying of infection and starvation.

Local fishers and a commercial tour operator have reported witnessing dolphins chasing baits and, in several instances, becoming hooked.

Since 2020, our respective departments have undertaken a review process to mitigate risks posed by fishing activity to dolphins in the ADS. PIRSA has led this process as the state's fishing management regulator.

I am advised that a background paper, a defensible risk assessment and an options paper have been produced. The risk assessment identifies a range of hook and lure sizes (3/0 and greater) and line strength (10lb and greater) which, if restricted, would significantly reduce risks of entanglement to ADS dolphins. I am advised that your Minister's Recreation Fisheries Advisory Committee has considered the options paper and that further consultation with the community can be expected, prior to any regulatory changes to restrict the use of these heavier gear combinations.

Imminent risks to ADS dolphins

The annual kingfish fishing season (spring and early summer) is rapidly approaching. Based on previous observations, intensive fishing effort can be expected in the inner waters of the Port River and Barker Inlet. ADS dolphins use these waterways daily, including, currently, two mother/calf pairs. I am concerned that the review process and regulatory response will not be completed in time to mitigate this approaching risk to ADS dolphins.

I am advised that under Section 79 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, certain fishing activities in specified areas may be temporarily prohibited. In view of the potential risk to the ADS dolphins, I ask that you give consideration to making a declaration restricting the use of identified high risk fishing gear in the waters of the Adelaide Dolphin Sanctuary within the Port River and Barker Inlet south of the St Kilda breakwater or any alternative measures which might decrease the risk to ADS dolphins.

Community and social impacts of proposed interim Regulations

The risk assessment undertaken as part of the review discussed above considered social and economic factors. It identified that restrictions applied in waters of the Port River and Barker Inlet south of St Kilda will have no impact on family fishing activity that targets smaller fish species, such as garfish and tommy ruff. It will not impact commercial fishing for larger species such as Bronze Whaler Shark in waters north of St Kilda.

National Parks and Wildlife Service rangers will be available to assist fisheries officers with community education and compliance activities associated with the prohibition.
