## Fisheries Management (Blue Crab Fishery) Regulations 2013

### Regulation 11

#### Revocation

As of 9 June 2023 the Determination made for the purposes of Regulation 11 dated 13 May 2023 will be hereby revoked.

#### Determination

For the purpose of Regulation 11 relating to catch and disposal requirements in the **Blue Crab** Fishery I make the following determinations commencing 9 June 2023 –

Licence holders must provide electronic catch and disposal records and reporting as described in this part.

# Regulation 11(1)(a) - (c) (record and provide information, arrangements for fish)

- (1) The holder of a licence in respect of the fishery or registered master of a boat from which Blue Crab is taken under such a licence must comply with the following provisions:
  - (a) immediately on landing Blue Crab taken under the licence he or she must weigh the crabs on accurate scales and complete Part A of electronic report 'Blue Crab CDR (Part A)' record;
  - (b) he or she must cause the Blue Crabs to which the completed Part A of electronic report 'Blue Crab CDR (Part A)' record relates to be transported to the registered premises of the registered fish processor specified on the record.
- (2) Blue Crabs taken pursuant to a Blue Crab Fishery licence must not be returned to a registered boat or a holding cage or a corf in the waters of the state once the Blue Crabs have been weighed and the certified weight has been recorded on Part B of the electronic report 'Blue Crab CDR (Part B)' record.
- (3) All Blue Crabs taken pursuant to this licence must be consigned to a registered fish processor that is listed on the Registrations and Entitlements register in relation to this licence for weighing within the State of South Australia.

## Regulation 11(3) (keeping of records)

(1) Where an electronic report has been completed and received by the Department for Blue Crab taken under a licence no further record need be kept for the purposes of this determination. For the purposes of this determination –

*Electronic report* – means an entry received in the eCatch electronic database created and administered by the Department. Submission of the electronic report may be directly entered into the eCatch electronic database via the myPIRSA portal (www.pir.sa.gov.au/ecatch); via the Commercial Fishing SA App; or other third party application. If entered by a third party application the Licence Holder, Registered Master or Nominated Agent must ensure the report has been received by the eCatch electronic database.

**Department -** means the Department of Primary Industries and Regions South Australia.
